

## Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Hiking – Hunting – Wildlife Viewing – Outdoor Photography

*Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized hunting activities.*

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires except in designated areas. Fires must be attended at all times.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal consumption only. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Target shooting is not allowed.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are not allowed.

## Fishing and Boating

*Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations.*

## Hunting and Trapping

*Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Hunting pamphlets for current regulations.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.

- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.

From Humansville, take Route N west 2 miles, then Farm Road 7 north 0.8 mile.


