

Recreational Opportunities

Hunting – Nature study and wildlife viewing –
Outdoor photography

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized hunting, dog training, and launching and landing boats.

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Hiking is allowed on interior roads and trails.
- Horseback riding is not allowed on the area.
- Target shooting is not allowed.
- Bicycles are not allowed.
- Camping is not allowed.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

There are no fishing opportunities in this area.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and limits except: only archery methods may be used. Deer hunting with firearms is prohibited.
- Firearms discharging single projectiles are not allowed.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.

From Willard, take Route O east, then Farm Road 105 north.


