

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and limits except: archery antlerless and firearms antlerless permits may not be used and the area is closed to firearms deer hunting during the urban and antlerless portions of the firearms deer season. The 4 point restriction applies.
- Only portable tree stands may be placed or used between September 1 and January 31. Each stand must be identified with the name and address of the user or conservation number and must be removed from the area by February 1. Use of nails, screw in steps or other material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Furbearers trapping is permitted by special-use permit.

Maple Leaf Lake Conservation Area

About This Area

This area, named for the fishing lake that is in the shape of a maple leaf, was purchased in 1989. The dam for the lake was completed in 1991 and the lake was stocked with channel catfish, bluegill, redear sunfish, and black bass in 1992. The open fields and wooded draws surrounding the lake are managed for deer, turkey, rabbits, quail, and songbirds through prescribed burning, edge feathering, and fescue conversion to native grasses. An 11.5-acre wetland located near the lake attracts waterfowl.

Rules & Regulations

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 pm to 4 am except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.



- No littering. No waste containers are provided. Area users should properly dispose of their own trash.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, edible wild greens and mushrooms may be taken for personal consumption.
- Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
 - Camping by special use permit only for youth groups. No amenities provided. Seasonal restrictions apply. Contact the area manager at 816-228-3766 for applications.
 - No horseback riding permitted.
 - Bicycles allowed only on roads open to vehicles and service roads.



Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed on Maple Leaf Lake and area ponds under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Fish may be taken only by pole and line and not more than 3 poles may be used by any one person.
- Daily limits are two black bass, four catfish in the aggregate (channel, blue and flathead catfish) and 30 crappie. All other fish, statewide limits, but may not exceed 20 in the aggregate.
- All black bass less than 15 inches in total length must be released immediately after being caught.
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken during the statewide seasons only by hand, handnet, atlatl, gig, bow, snagging, snaring, grabbing, pole and line, a twenty-two (.22) caliber or smaller rimfire rifle or pistol, pellet gun, or crossbow and only on and within dates and hours those waters are open to fishing or hunting. An artificial light may be used. Season: sunset June 30 through October 31. Daily limit 8.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization.
- Boats may be used only for fishing and wildlife activities and may not be left unattended overnight. Houseboats are prohibited.
- Electric motors only are allowed on area ponds.
- On Maple Leaf Lake, electric motors and outboard motors may be used; however motors over 10 horsepower must be operated at a slow, no-wake speed.
- Commercial fishing tournaments require a special use permit along with the associated fee and proof of liability insurance. Commercial use is defined as any activity which results in economic gain for a private individual or entity. Example is holding a competition which results in winners getting cash prizes or items of significant
