

Recreational Opportunities

Hunting – Fishing – Hiking – Nature study and wildlife viewing – Outdoor Photography

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized fishing, hunting, and dog training activities.

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Camping is not allowed.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Horseback riding is not allowed on the area.
- Bicycling allowed only on public roadways.
- Target shooting is not allowed.
- Any activity for groups of 10 or more require a special-use permit. Contact area manager.
- Guiding for pay is not allowed.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are not allowed.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Bullfrogs and green frogs may not be taken with firearms. Frogs may be taken by hand, hand-net, gig, longbow, snagging, snaring, grabbing, or pole and line and only on waters open to fishing.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer and turkey regulations are subject to annual changes. Please refer to the Spring Turkey or Fall Deer and Turkey Hunting pamphlets for current regulations.
- Firearms which fire single projectiles prohibited.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit. Contact area manager.

From Lockwood, take Highway 97 north 4 miles, then Route VV west 2 miles, and Dade 51 north 0.75 mile.


