

## RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bird Watching — Bicycling — Fishing  
Hiking — Outdoor Photography

*Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.*

- No littering.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Primitive camping permitted on a walk-in basis with seasonal closures.
- Bicycles are allowed on service roads and roads open to vehicles.
- No target shooting allowed.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are not allowed.

## Fishing and Boating

*Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Fish may be taken only by pole and line and not more than 3 poles may be used by any person.
- Daily limit is 6 black bass and 4 channel catfish and 30 crappie. All other species - 20 in the aggregate.
- All bass between 12-15 inches in length must be immediately returned to the water.
- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken from waters open to fishing or hunting during the statewide season in accordance with statewide limits and methods except firearms may not be used.

- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization. (not needed on most areas)
- Boats may be used only for fishing and wildlife activities and may not be left unattended overnight.
- Only electric motors are permitted.

## Hunting and Trapping

*Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Tywappity Community Lake is closed to hunting.
- On Tywappity Towersite deer hunting is allowed but only archery methods may be used. Deer hunting with firearms is prohibited. All other statewide deer seasons and limits apply.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special use permit.



