

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Bird Watching — Bicycling — Fishing — Hiking
Hunting — Wildlife Viewing — Photography
Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting activities.

• **Public use is prohibited, except fishing and waterfowl hunting by boat only, when Mississippi River is at or above twenty-nine (29') feet on the New Madrid gauge.**

- No littering, digging, fireworks, target shooting, open fires, swimming or speed boating.
- Do not park in front of, or block gates.
- Dogs must be leashed or confined when not used for training or hunting.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles and ATV's are allowed on entrance roadway and in parking area.
- To access the area cross 2.5 miles of dirt road. Property on both sides of the road is privately owned. Please respect the rights and privacy of the landowners by not leaving the roadway or using it under wet weather conditions. Use of ATV is encouraged on entrance road.
- Primitive camping is permitted in parking lot.
- Campers are limited to 14 consecutive days in a 30-day period, with a total of 30 days within a calendar year. Groups of 10 or more need a special use permit.
- Feeding and baiting of wildlife prohibited.
- Guiding for pay is prohibited on department areas.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exemptions:

- Fish may be taken only by pole and line and not more than 2 unlabeled poles may be used by any person when fishing the Mississippi River.
- When fishing the Mississippi River from Girvin Conservation Area, fishermen are restricted to Mississippi River fishing regulations.

- Bullfrogs and green frogs may be taken from waters open to fishing or hunting during the statewide season in accordance with statewide limits and methods.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization.
- Boats may be used for fishing and wildlife-related activities and may not be left unattended overnight.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and methods except: Only archery and muzzleloading methods may be used. All other statewide deer seasons and limits apply.
- Portable tree stands may be placed and used between September 1 and January 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address, or conservation number, of the owner and be removed from the area before February 1. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted, but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and non-woody vegetation.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted only by special use permit.

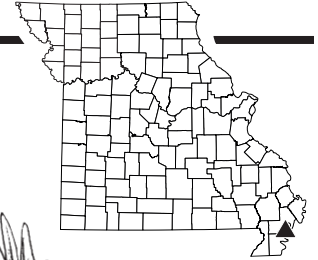
