

Area Highlights

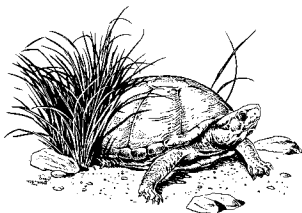
Hickory Woods is a 10-acre forested area with limited hiking opportunities. It is located adjacent to the City of Bridgeton's Gentry Park, which offers additional recreation facilities including restrooms, a playground, swimming pool and picnic tables. The area is leased to and maintained by the City of Bridgeton Parks and Recreation, 314-739-5599. From I-270 take the St Charles Rock Road exit east, take Natural Bridge Road east and Fee Fee Road south to the area parking lot.

This Conservation Area is open sunrise to sunset.

- No open fires or fireworks.
- Camping is prohibited.
- Bicycling and horseback riding are prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed in parking areas only.
- No target shooting is allowed.
- Dogs must be leashed at all times.
- Nuts, berries, fruits and mushrooms may be taken for personal use. Digging, cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- No capture or removal of any wildlife.
- No picking, collection, destruction or defacing of any natural objects.
